

Message from the Deputy Headteacher:

Dear Parents & Carers,

Well done to all of our school community – pupils, parents and teachers for getting through this term so far whilst lockdown has continued. I am sure many of you are happy to see the full return to school on Monday 8th March, I know we are definitely looking forward to seeing all of you again. However, I am sure some of you are anxious about this too. Peterborough's transmission rate remains high (around 200 per 100,000) so it is extremely important that vigilance to the measures in place on site are adhered to. All of our risk assessment documentation has been placed on the website for you to look through. We will be enforcing:

- The way system around site with the entrance remaining at the KS1 gate and exit from the KS2 gates.
- The entry gate will be open from 8.35am to 8.50am please arrive any time between these times rather than all at 8.35am. This will assist with social distancing on site and the number of children waiting to access cloakrooms.
- Anyone over the age of 11 is asked to wear a face mask whilst on site.
- Staff will continue to wear visors and face masks when travelling in the building and if holding discussions with parents.

By working together to keep Lime Academy Watergall as safe from transmission as possible, we can make this a positive experience for all. Lateral Flow testing kits are available to all our families and these can be collected daily from any of the Peterborough test sites. You do not need to order these and if you cannot make it to any of the collection points then you can request that these are delivered by visiting <http://orlo.uk/h6HLZ> or by calling 119. These tests are for adults only and will help to protect education settings through regular testing minimising transmission.

This week, it has been lovely to see the level of learning remain high and at an excellent standard too. We hope that you have all enjoyed the books

that were gifted to you by school, we have enjoyed seeing some of your fabulous work both in school and being uploaded to our online platforms too. We have shared some images later in the newsletter.

Through the hard work of children and the collaboration of parents & staff we have managed to successfully achieve the National Online Safety 'Safe Remote Education' award. I have attached the logo to show this accreditation and to thank you for your contribution.

A reminder that school uniform expectations will remain high with all children required to wear a school tie, school jumper and black school shoes. Thank you for your continued understanding with this.
