

## Message from the Head teacher:

Dear Parents/Carers,

It's been another busy week in school. It has been lovely to see parents from EYFS and Year 1 come into school this week for maths workshops with the children. If you were able to attend one of these sessions, thank you! It is really encouraging to see so many of you visit the school and I know that the children really enjoyed having the opportunity to show you all how they learn. If you weren't able to make the workshops but would like some more information on maths in school, please speak to your child's teacher. Parent teacher meetings have also taken place this week and I know that teachers have welcomed the opportunity to speak to you about the progress your children are making.

Year 3 have been out to visit Peterborough Museum this week as they continue to learn about life as a tudor. In addition to the workshop in the museum they also walked into the centre of the city to visit the Cathedral and look for tudor buildings.
